

- Leash law and licensing complaints
- Barking and nuisance complaints

- Replace with telemedicine for foster rechecks, medication refills, etc




Sample decision tree on emergencies (NJ VMA)

- Is this procedure necessary to save the animal's life?
- Is it necessary to alleviate pain or suffering?
- Does it prevent zoonotic disease?
- Could it be managed in a way that mitigates COVID risk?
- Does it require use of scarce resources needed for critical human medical care?
- Or can this patient safely wait until resources are less scarce and human health risks are lower?



A risk-based approach to decision-making in the COVID-19 environment



Risk-based triage

- College of Veterinarians of Ontario
- A veterinarian must make a judgment call based on the animal, the context, their competence, public safety and staff safety
- With COVID-19 restrictions likely in place for at least another month, or perhaps longer, the increasing desire to have a list of what can or can't be done is growing. Despite the demand, the College cannot make these decisions on urgent care and presenting cases for you.



Spay/neuter is non-emergency

- "We were all making fantastic strides and this is a punch to the
- Essential surgery is for
 - Life-threatening, rapid deterioration, permanent dysfunction, relief of suffering
- Spay/neuter must be paused to preserve resources, protect personnel, relieve burden on healthcare system
 - Neuter before adoption → adopt/foster with agreements
 - Trap-neuter-return → leave cats in place for now
 - Do not euthanize or hold animals in shelter pending spay/neuter
 - Temporary exemption from NBA laws

Unprecedented actions to save lives as shelter capacity contracts

- Stage an evacuation of shelter animals into the community
- Curbside/appointmentbased adoptions and foster, tele-adoptions
- Urgent pleas to the community
- Eliminate traditional barriers to placement




Managing the PPE/supply shortage

- Support other orgs by transporting and returning cats to outdoor homes after TNR









WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU FIND KITTENS?



DON'T BE A KITTEN NAPPER

Mom will likely return. Please don't intervene.

DID MOM COME BACK? NO YES

HOORAY! Let mom care for them until they are 8 weeks old. Then make sure mom and kittens get spayed/neutered. Help them find a home.

If mom has vanished for more than 8 hours, she may not be coming back.

You'd make a great foster! During kitten season, shelters are overrun and don't have adequate resources for proper care. Please care for them in your home until they're 8 weeks old.

Kittens that need help:



This guide refers to Kittens 4 weeks of age and younger, when care with mom offers them the BEST chance of survival. Kittens that fit the descriptions below are possibly abandoned and need help from humans.

Cold Young kittens cannot regulate their own body temperature, and rely on mom, their siblings, and nesting material to keep them warm. They may lose some heat when mom is not with them, so unless they ALSO fit any of the other descriptions below, leave them and check again in 2-4 hours to see if mom came back.

Dirty A good mama cat keeps her babies meticulously clean. Kittens that need your help may have dirt, feces, or crusted urine on their bodies. They may be wet. Their genital areas may be red and inflamed, indicating urine

Thin Kittens with a mom should be eating frequently. Their bellies will typically have a full, rounded appearance. Sunken bellies, visible bones, and pale skin can indicate that the kittens need help and aren't being fed.

Noisy Orphaned and hungry kittens will cry loudly. But loud kittens alone does not indicate that they are orphaned. Mom does not stay with the kittens all day long, and might be on her way back. She might even be watching you in the shadows, waiting for YOU to leave her babies alone. Leave these kittens alone for 2-4 hours, then check on them again. If they are quiet when you return, that means mom has probably been back to care for them, and you should let her keep up the good work.

Hurt

Sick/ Sick kittens might have discharge from the eyes and nose. Their eyes may be crusted shut. They may have wounds or open sores.



Short-term use of megestrol acetate for estrus prevention in cats during Covid-19-related cessation of surgical sterilization in the U.S.

When spaying isn't an option

- Megestrol acetate at 0.625 mg/kg orally once weekly
- Estrus suppression
- Available from compounding pharmacies as oral liquid
- Affordable and safe pregnancy prevention for foster and adopted cats pending completion of sterilization agreements





Community cats

- MA generally used as a stopgap while awaiting TNR and for hard-to-trap cats
- Has been fed to individual cats in canned food weekly or as a bulk mix divided into plastic dishes 1-2x weekly
- VCPR: Who is the owner?
 How to adapt "herd" health concepts?




Community cat case study

- 20 acre government housing complex in Florida
- 1999 to present: managed with TNR and adoption
- MA for new cats (even if sex unknown), hard to trap cats
- One un-trappable cat had 9 litters, then treated successfully with MA 2008-2013
- Colony peaked at 135 and currently at 20 cats
- "The only side effect from the medicine is a positive one: the mom cats start to look healthy."
