Balancing Risk & Benefit

- Benefit
 - •Community relationships (We matter too!)
 - Managing overpopulation
 - •Ensuring adequate protection for pets/people
 - Student experiences
- Risk
 - COVID transmission
 - Volunteer to volunteer
 - Volunteer to community
 - Community to volunteer
 - Reputational risk

Managing Risk

- •Minimize risk of transmission
 - Volunteer pool is from same bubble (OVC)
 - Volunteers testing prior to entry
 - No client contact
 - •All consultations via telemedicine in advance
 - Drop off/Pick up contact only
 - Extensive client education during consult & written discharge instructions
 - Contactless payment or cash in envelope
 - Daily screening of volunteers
 - Clients/families all screened day before and at dropoff

Flexibility

- Community and OVC has veto power
- Activity can be cancelled right up to last minute
- •All parties are monitoring COVID numbers
